

# Recital Information Sheet

**Costumes are mandatory for picture day, dress rehearsal and recital**

**Make-up isn't required for picture day but we recommend light blush and lipstick or gloss to not appear washed out.**

**Make-Up-** All students should wear proper stage make-up in order to not appear washed out on stage. You can modify some of the requirements for the very young dancers, but at the very least all students should have lipstick and blush (babies too!)  
Make-up is required for Dress Rehearsal also!!!

1. Select a foundation slightly darker than your skin tone. This minimizes stage light washout. Try a stick foundation. Dot on and blend into neckline being certain to not leave a makeup line around the jaw line.  
Apply loose powder to face to remove shine. Use a color that matches the foundation.
2. Apply blush.
3. Apply black eyeliner. Must have ½ inch line coming out from the corner of the eye. You should also trace the rest of the eye with eyeliner but if you have a small child please make sure you at least have the line coming from the corner.
4. Apply eye shadow using shades of brown. A line of the darkest brown should be applied from the inner corner of your lid up and across the entire lower half (to the crease) of the lid, then the middle shade sweeping up toward the eyebrow. Using a lighter, complimentary shade of brown to cover the remaining upper portion of your lid and a white shimmery shade up to your eyebrow.
5. Apply heavy mascara and/or false eyelashes.
6. Lipstick- Red, we recommend L'Oreal British Red.

**Hair-** Use the following styles unless otherwise advised by your instructor. Use for picture day, dress rehearsal, and recital.

All Twinkle Babies, Twinkle Stars, Tap, Ballet, Lyrical, Jazz, Jazz/Pom Classes- Bun

All Hip-Hop and Acro Classes- Ponytail

(If you your child's hair is too short or fine to get into a bun, do the best you can and pull the sides back.)

**Bun-** All hair slicked back with a bun at the back middle of the head, between the ears. Make sure to use bobby pins and a hair net so it won't fall out. If you have a hard time making a perfect bun we highly recommend a foam donut, these are carried at Sally's Beauty Supply. Use a lot of hair spray and gel to slick it down. No Bangs. Bobby Pin in any extra hair pieces that came with the costume. Flower pins or bows should go on the right side of the bun.

**Ponytail-** Slicked back with a ponytail at the middle of the back of the head.

Bangs cast a shadow on stage and typically it's over the child's face, try to eliminate bangs or have them be very light!
